



TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR NEW COMMERCIAL PLEASURE CRAFT LICENCE

New commercial pleasure craft licence will be issued only to Mauritians who are not already holders of a commercial pleasure craft licence and subject to the following conditions:

1. New craft should be constructed in accordance with ISO 12217 Standards
2. Imported craft should be less than five years and ISO/CE certified
3. Carrying capacity of craft not ISO/CE certified will be determined as per the Pleasure Craft Management System.
4. Priority of consideration would be given to innovative projects that enhance the level of service, comfort and are environment-friendly.
5. Conversion of private pleasure craft licence into commercial pleasure craft licence would not be allowed except in case of replacement of craft for an existing licence.
6. No licence would be issued at the following Embarkation Points (EPs) due to over-concentration of crafts:
 - **Eastern Coast:** All EPs falling within the coastline from Pointe Lafayette to Bois des Amourettes including Ile aux Cerfs
 - **Northern Coast:** Mon Choisy, Pte aux Cannoniers, Bain Boeuf, Pereybere and Balaclava
 - **Western Coast:** Flic en Flac, La Preneuse and Wolmar
 - **South Eastern Coast:** Blue Bay and Pointe Jerome at Mahebourg

Any individual or company, whose application for a commercial pleasure craft licence was **NOT** approved on account of the previous policy, should submit a fresh application based on the above terms and conditions.

The Tourism Authority reserves the right not to issue any licence at a given Embarkation Point on ground of over-concentration of pleasure craft and for boating safety.
